## Former B'nai B'rith Woman Of Year Dies

Mrs. Mickey Dlin, 44, recipient of the B'nai B'rith's 1965 Woman of the Year award for outstanding community service, has died.

Mrs. Dlin was born in North Battleford, Sask., moving to Edmonton in 1928.

Mrs. Dlin was one of the most active women of the Jewish community in Edmonton. She was a member of the national executive of Hadassah World International Zionist Organizations; the National Council of Jewish Women; Beth Israel Sisterhood; the John Howard Society and the United Community Fund.

She was also past president of the Hadassah council of Edmonton, chairman of the Youth Aliyah Children's Relief Fund, and vice-president of the Jewish Family Services.

Mrs. Dlin is survived by her

husband Mickey, one son Ronald, 22, two daughters, Cory 17, and Marni, 10, her mother, Mrs. Fanny Podolsky, and one brother Cecil Pawl, all of Edmonton.

Funeral services were to be held at the Jewish funeral parlor, Chevra Kadisha, 12313 105th Avenue at 2 p.m. today.
