

North Storeman, S. Kushner, Dies

A funeral service was conducted Sunday afternoon at Connelly-McKinley's chapel for Sam Kushner, 65-year-old Northern Canadian storeman who died Friday evening following a brief illness.

Mr. Kushner opened a store in Fort McMurray in 1914, which he operated for the next 20 years. At the end of that time, he moved to Yellowknife where he operated a store until he became ill a few weeks ago.

The service was conducted by Rabbi Poston and was followed by burial in the family plot, Edmonton Jewish cemetery. Surviving are his wife and two sons, David and Leslie, and two sisters in Montreal.

Northern Trader, S. Kushner Dies

Pioneer northern trader, Samuel Kushner, 65, of 10039 115 st., died in a city hospital Saturday. Funeral services were held at 2:30 Sunday in Connelly and McKinley chapel. Rabbi Postone officiated.

Mr. Kushner was well known throughout the northland, having operated a store in McMurray for 20 years from 1914 to 1934. He moved to Yellowknife that year and operated a store there until recently when illness forced him to return to Edmonton.

Surviving him are Mrs. Kushner, two sons, David and Leslie, both at home, two sisters in Montreal, Mrs. Redler and Mrs. Fox.

Interment was in the family plot in the Edmonton Jewish cemetery.
