IN ETHEL'S FAMILY, IT WAS NONE OF THESE. ETHEL WAS VERY PETITE. AS THE CHILDREN WERE GROWING THEY WOULD STAND NEXT TO HER AND TEASINGLY MEASURE THEIR HEIGHT BY HERS. WHEN THEY FINALLY WERE ABLE TO STAND UP TO HER, NOSE TO NOSE, THEY WERE CONSIDERED ADULT. ONE OR TWO MAY HAVE BEEN 9 OR 10 YEARS OLD WHEN THEY REACHED THE LOFTY HEIGHT OF SOMETHING LESS THAN 5 FEET. BUT AS THEY MEASURED UP TO HER, THEY WERE GIVEN THE MANTLE OF MATURITY.

THERE IS A METAPHOR IN THE ANECDOTE. ETHEL MAY HAVE BEEN SHORT IN STATURE, BUT WHEN IT CAME TO LIFE, SHE STOOD TALL AND PROUD.

SHE WAS A VERY UNDERSTANDING WOMAN. JERRY TALKS OF HER AS

SOMEONE TO WHOM HE COULD BRING HIS PROBLEMS. SHE WAS SOMEONE

"I COULD TALK TO ABOUT BUSINESS OR OTHER PROBLEMS. I KNEW

IT WOULD BE IN CONFIDENCE. SHE WAS ALWAYS THERE FOR ME. SHE

WAS A GOOD LISTENER."

AND NIECES AND NEPHEWS WERE INTERCHANGEABLE. LAYLA SAYS IT
WAS AS IF HER CHILDREN HAD EXTRA GRANDPARENTS. THERE AS A
SPECIAL RELATIONSHIP. SURE IT WAS BUBBE MINI AND AUNT ETHEL,
BUT THE FAMILY WAS SO CLOSE IT WAS LIKE HAVING TWO BUBBAS.

BEV REMEMBERS THE SPECIALLY CHOSEN CARDS AND GIFTS THAT ALWAYS

CAME PROMPTLY TO HER CHILDREN DURING SPECIAL OCCASIONS. SHE

NEVER FORGOT. YOU COULD ALMOST SET YOUR CALENDAR BY THE POSTMAN'S

DELIVERTES.

ON THE ONE HAND SHE LIKED THE MODERN CONVENIENCES OF LIFE AND WAS UNDERSTANDING OF NEW TRENDS AND VALUES AND ON THE OTHER HAND SHE WAS CONTENT TO PLAY THE ROLE OF FINE LADY - IMPECCABLY CORRECT, PROPERLY SERVING GUESTS TEA AND PASTERIES ON HER FINEST CHINA.

WORLD INHERITED FROM HER PARENTS WITH HER MANY SUPERSTITIONS
AND HER PERSONAL VALUES AND THE OTHER THE MODERN WORLD WHERE
SHE WAS ABLE TO LISTEN SYMPATHETICALLY TO THE PROBLEMS OF HER

SHE WAS VERY SOCIALLY ACTIVE - BELONGING TO HADASSAH - PLAYING CARDS - BUILDING FRIENDSHIPS.

BLESSINGS, NEVER SORROWS. SHE HAD FAITH IN GOD THE PROVIDER

OF ALL BLESSINGS. FOR MANY YEARS A MEMBER OF BETH SHALOM,

THE SYNAGOGUE AND JEWISH LIFE WERE IMPORTANT TO HER. SHE ATTENDED

SERVICES REGULARLY; LIT SHABBAT CANDLES; AND SUPPORTED THE

SYNAGOGUE.

ALMOST EVERYONE WHO KNEW HER SURPASSED HER PHYSICAL STATURE.

BUT SHE WAS SMALL IN A PHYSICAL WAY ONLY. THOSE WHO LOVED

ETHEL LEVY CAN HOPE THAT THE EXAMPLE SHE SET, AS WIFE, MOTHER

AND SISTER, CAN BE INSPIRATIONAL TO THEM.

AND SOMEDAY - IF YOU TRY VERY HARD - AND CARRY WITH YOU THE EXAMPLE SHE SET - YOU WILL MEASURE UP TO HER STANDARDS.

SHE HAD AN EXTRA-ORDINARY RELATIONSHIP WITH HER SISTER MINI.

THEY DID EVERYTHING TOGETHER. AND LIVED CLOSE TO ONE ANOTHER.

BEV RECALLS THIS FAMILY STORY. "WHEN ETHEL AND HAROLD MARRIED,
THEY MOVED TO THE GREAT METROPOLIS OF MANNVILLE WHERE HAROLD
OPENED UP A STORE. AFTER ONE DAY SHE WAS SO LONELY, SHE TOOK
A TRAIN BACK HOME TO NORTH BATTLEFORD. THEIR FATHER SENT MINI
BACK TO KEEP HER COMPANY AND SHE STAYED FOR TWO MONTHS. THEN
THEY BOTH CAME HOME. SHE WOULD STAY A FEW DAYS AND THEN GO
BACK. THEY WERE TOGETHER EVER SINCE.

IVOR AND LAYLA BOTH SPEAK OF ETHEL AS A "LADY". SHE WAS NOT EXTRAVAGANT, BUT LIKED THE GOOD THINGS IN LIFE. SHE WAS ALWAYS A GOOD MONEY MANAGER AND SHE WOULD HAVE TWO PUSHKAS - ONE THE FAMED BLUE BOX FOR CHARITY AND THE OTHER FOR PERSONAL SAVINGS.

HER WORLD WAS A SYNTHESIS BETWEEN THE OLD AND THE NEW.

ETHER CENY

AND THOSE HERE TODAY WHO MOURN HER PASSING, WILL GIVE HER THE GREATEST OF LEGACIES IF HER MEMORY CAN INSPIRE THEM TO MEASURE UP TO HER ACCOMPLISHMENTS AND HER BLESSINGS.

SHE HAD THE BLESSING OF HER LOVING RELATIONSHIP WITH HER HUSBAND HAROLD. FOR 58 YEARS THEY SHARED THEIR LIVES. THEIRS WAS A LOVING, CARING RELATIONSHIP. THEY DID MUCH TOGETHER; SHE WOULD WORK WITH HAROLD IN HIS BUSINESS, HELPING OUT, BEING HIS FULL PARTNER. AND THEY WOULD RELAX TOGETHER LISTENING TO YIDDISH MUSIC OR TALKING.
