 a dapper image at the time (unty Estelle is one of 3 faces in
 the whole town, but w/ Aunt ^{w/} Sarah always accompanying the
 young couple as chaperone, he had to work fast - they were married
 less than a year after they met).

Estelle speaks of him as a quiet unassuming man who went through
 life being pleasant, a man about whom no-one had a bad word to say.
 During these past months their love for one another ~~was~~^{was clearly tested} ~~was no longer~~
 in time of crisis. ~~During when~~ Estelle was ~~Hospitalized~~ ^{after} returning from the Hospital following her
 heart attack Max took care of everything - from household chores
 to ferrying her around on the bus - never letting her be removed
 from his sight. & when Max was hospitalized during his recent
 illness - Estelle was there every day - bringing home made goodies
 & love & offering encouragement & hope.

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For 66 years they were together
sharing their love
sharing their life - taking long walks - enjoy a quiet loving
relationship.
