Please be seated.

In a few minutes the members of the Chevra Kadisha will assist you in leaving the sanctuary, past Tevie's casket and down the front stairs.

Those wishing to join the family for the interment may follow the procession to the Jewish Cemetery, located on 101 Avenue at 76 Street.

When we leave the cemetery, a seven day period of mourning, called "Shiva", begins. It is a time of prayer, reflection and remembrance. It is the beginning of intense mourning that centers on the bereaved and is the time for friends to comfort them.

The Shiva period honouring Tevie Miller begins this afternoon and continues until next Thursday morning. The family has asked that it be observed in Tevie and Arliss' home as well as here at the synagogue. The first prayer service will take place at 5:30 this afternoon in our downstairs chapel.

Because of the importance of the Sabbath in Jewish religious and communal life, Shiva is not observed from Friday night through Saturday night and mourners are encouraged to participate in the celebration of the holiday, even in the midst of Shiva.

The observance of Shiva will recommence with prayer services at 9:00 a.m. Sunday in the downstairs chapel. Afternoon prayer services will then be held at 5:30 p.m Sunday through Wednesday. Morning services will be at 7:30 a.m., on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday all in our downstairs chapel.

At other times, friends are welcome to pay condolence calls on the family at 34 Riverside Crescent beginning on Sanday.
