May some comfort come to them, from the thought that their dear one-left, not only many grieving friends, but a living, pulsating monument to his memory - the Edmonton Talmud Torah - May his soul rest in peace.

This is the Yorcheit Service of the late Leo PEkarsky, who passed away just one year ago.

Those of us who have gathered here this morning, have done so, to pay homage and respect, with bowed heads in sorrow, and fond, kindly memories, of a man whose influence, will be felt for generations to come, a man who was loyal and dedicated to all things Jewish.

It was Leo Pekarsky's knowledge of Jewish affairs, his dedication to Hebrew language, his respect for learning, all of which made for his greatness.

He left a record of achievement that cannot be measured in terms of one brief span of life.

Leo Pekarsky arrived in Edmonton at the youthful age of eighteen, coming direct into my parents, home, where he lived until he married.

He gave long and devoted service to our T. T., beginning as a teacher, then as principal and then as Chairman of the Board of Education, and culminating his career of service to the school, as President in the year in which we dedicated this new school building.

He was a self-made man, who had made a success of his life, in every field of endeavour. He was a man with remarkable energy, and extraordinary capacity for hard, ceaseless work, an almost bewildering driving force, and above all, a clear understanding of the duties, and responsibilities, of a Jew to his country, his community and, uppermost, to his family.

He, it was, and together with others, who experienced the most formative decades of the T. T. with its struggles, and achievements, its failures and its successes.

The tottering twenties, the impoverished thirties, the fearful forties, right into the fateful fifties, when the fate of the whole human race, including our own people in heroic Israel, seemed to hang

on a slender thread - as the fate of the T. T. today, which has scaled the heights in Hebrew education hangs on a slender thread today because of heavy demands and seemingly lack of resources.

Ladies and Gentlemen, this school must always remain as a living memorial to Leo Pekarsky and others, who put so much of themselves into making it what it is today.

As President of the T. T. I wish to remind you, that last year we had established, located in the board room, a library in his memory, known as the Leo Pekarsky Memorial Library, so that each, and every time, we enter the board room, for our deliberations we are reminded of a man who was so loyal a worker, so inspiring a leader, and so unselfish and dedicated to this Institution.
