An insatiable thirst for knowled e and a driving force to learn. Without the aid of a formal education she read all she could over the years - philosophy, history, religion and literature - and could discuss these freely.

Although not a religious - centred vew, she was nevertheless a good Jew, in the sense of Sholem Aleichem, Peretz and Bialik.

A woman with the love of music and song in her heart and soul.

A woman with a feeling for the Yiddish Theatre since she was a young girl, who contributed much in this activity to the City of Winnipeg in her early years, and to Edmonton in her later years.

A woman who stood firmly believed in what she believed to be the Truth. She stood by her convictions whether they were popular or not.

A Nother who without the aid of the Holy Book nevertheless reared her children in the spirit of Moses Commandments.

A woman who saw injuitice in the world - and it grieved her terribly - and she could not be silent. Although this may have sometimes placed her just outside the safe domain of conformity, it nevertheless placed her in the lap of Jodly acceptance - if a belief in God means a belief in what is good, and what is beautiful and what is just and fair to all living men.

This, was va Shaw.
