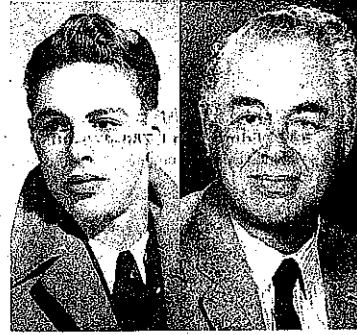

It is with great sadness that we announce the passing of Norman Witten on November 26, 2013, at the age of 85. He passed away peacefully at home.

He is survived by his wife of 62 years, Mona; by his children, Mark (Anne Churchill-Smith), Stephen and Randy; his granddaughter, Leah; sister Evelyn (Edgar Morris); and brother Larry (Marielle); plus a numerous nieces and nephews and extended family. Norm was predeceased by his parents, Abe and Anne Witten.

Norm grew up in Perdue, Saskatchewan, and then attended the University of Saskatchewan, receiving his Bachelor of Arts degree in 1949. Norm moved to Edmonton, along with his family, in 1949, eventually enrolling in the Faculty of Law at the University of Alberta, and graduating as Gold Medalist in 1953. He was admitted to the Alberta bar in 1954, and began his legal practice with Abe and Tevie Miller at the law firm of Miller & Miller, soon to become Miller, Miller & Witten, and today Witten LLP. Norm remained with the law firm for the rest of his life. Norm was a guiding force for the firm for his whole career, serving as managing partner for over 20 years, and sharing his insight, advice, skills, mentorship and leadership with colleagues, clients, the legal community and the broader community. In addition to his contributions to the legal community, he had leadership roles in many community organizations spanning several decades, including the Menorah Curling Club, Northern Alberta Curling Association, Glendale Golf and Country Club, United Jewish Appeal, Canadian Council of Christians and Jews, Edmonton Downtown Development Corporation, Mayfair Golf and Country Club, and University Hospitals Board (University of Alberta).

In his retirement years, Norm, together with Mona, continued to enjoy many pursuits, including his passion for golf and bridge, with their many friends, both in Edmonton and at their winter home in Scottsdale, Arizona.

Norm's family, friends and colleagues will greatly miss him.

Shiva will continue at the family home, Friday, November 29 from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m., and Saturday, November 30 from 7:00 to 9:00 p.m.
