# Man, wife, both 73, die on same day

A man and his wife, both 73, died Monday within minutes of each other — both from heart attacks.

When Harry Zurin, of 10612 125th St., collapsed in his kitchen about 10:10 p.m., his wife, Jessie, called an ambulance.

As Mr. Zurin was being placed on a stretcher, Mrs. Zurin also collapsed. She was pronounced dead on arrival at Royal Alexandra Hospital.

Mr. Zurin died shortly after, while being treated in the hospital's emergency ward.

Mr. Zurin came to Canada from Russia when a child. For years he operated a restaurant outside the Manning depot, where thousands of airmen during the Second World War knew him only as "Harry."

He was one of the original members of the Edmonton B'nai Brith organization.

Mrs. Zurin was born in Buffalo, N.Y. The Zurins are survived by two sons, Arnold, 48, of 10821 140th St., and Gerald, of Prince George, B.C.
